Unconventional Tour: Making Waves 2008 in Albuquerque

November 2nd, just days before the Presidential Election, something *unconventional* is coming to the Albuquerque Center for Peace and Justice. With the upcoming election so close, the group from California is touring the US, to “mobilize and inspire voters”, says Penny Little, documentary filmmaker and musician who is spearheading the tour.

The Unconventional Tour: Making Waves 2008, will feature some great new political music from California’s “Away Team” plus a film showing of Penny Little’s award winning film “Electile Dysfunction” for an evening of a “mashup” of music, politics and multi-media. California’s Secretary of State, Debra Bowen has publicly stated that this is her favorite film.

Penny adds that “This is not just a tour. We are filming the entire event. There will be a Free Speech contest during intermission, judged by clap-o-meter. We want people to get involved in the political process -- whether it’s voting, boycotting, campaigning, becoming the media, demonstrating, running for office, *doing something*. We want to put the party back into politics!”

The Unconventional crew include Penny Little, Nik Green, and Dawn Perrine -- making their way from Santa Barbara to Tulsa, Little Rock, St. Louis, Bloomington, Chicago, Austin and Albuquerque. Inviting local musicians and special guest speakers is a feature of the tour, making each event different, unconventional and shaped by local input.

Penny Little and Nik Green both came from major labels signed bands joined together to form the electronic duo - The Away Team. Nik worked with Roy Harper and Jimmy Page on a project after the demise of Led Zeppelin, and is a film composer, having scored several films, including Penny’s “9/11 Dust and Deceit” “Electile Dysfunction”, “JFK II, (by John Hankey) - and many others, Penny was signed to Warner/Chappell in the UK and has toured the US, Japan, Europe as a singer songwriter. Her documentary films have played to packed houses in Europe, Australia, Japan, and the US. Dawn Perrine, a filmmaker in her own right, has been part of this People to People TV entourage since 2003.
